

## 2022 After First week of play

All,

There is a slight change to the rules that only affects a couple people in the league but just making everyone aware.....

- Players turning age 75 and above during the calendar year of league play may elect to drive from the **YELLOW** tees, while remaining to be eligible for all applicable prizes. Players age 60 and above on or before the first night of league play may elect to drive from the Senior (GREEN) tees, while remaining to be eligible for all applicable prizes. From the first night of play, the player will need to select which tees he/she will play from, then he/she will be expected to play from these same designated tees during the course of the entire season. Long drive specific flags will be placed on holes where all tees have equal advantage, ie: no long drive on Hole #7, ***MUST play from that position to sign Long Drive flags.***

Brookwood has changed the tee color of the previous RED tees to YELLOW. The new RED tees will eventually be painted SILVER. So league members 75 and older, Ladies, and those with special tee exemptions will now use the YELLOW tees.

We are taking 2 weeks to establish team handicaps so there will be no results on the website until after play next week.

Some reminders from things observed in week 1

Scorecards will be located in the clubhouse snack bar by the bulletin board.

The first group out needs to grab the proximity markers that will be near the scorecards. Place the tee sheet on the first tee and place the other proximities on the applicable holes.

Please mark off your group on the first tee so we know who is on the course.

The last group needs to pick up the markers. Please remove the sheets from the markers and place the sheets in the box with the scorecards. Leave everything in the box and put it in the clubhouse in the same area the scorecards were picked up.

Be ready when it is your tee time.

You have 3 minutes to look for a lost ball. If that ball can't be found you will have to use your partners last shot. If that ball has already been picked up then you will have to take a lost ball penalty of one stroke and drop near where you, and the opposing team, think the ball was last seen.

Pace of play should be 2 hours or less in a scramble format. The first couple groups finished in 2 hours this week and then it dwindled off to 2 hours 20 minutes plus. Do your best to keep up with the group ahead of you.
